Dr. Ursula Bernauer, Soziologin und Analytische Psychotherapeutin mit eigener Praxis in Freiburg/Breisgau, Vortrags- und Seminartätigkeit, Veröffentlichungen im Bereich der Religionspsychologie



Anita Chapman is a Zurich graduate with private practice in Asheville, N.C. since 1988. She has been active in the training program of the I-RSJA and lectures in Zurich. Formerly Chair of the English Department of the American International High School in The Hague, she obtained her Doctorate in Dramaturgy from the University of Amsterdam. Her book, EDWARD ALBEE: THE POET OF LOSS, approaches the playwright's work from a Jungian Perspective. Currently, she is proud to be President of The Autumn Players, a senior outreach group connected with The Asheville Community Theater.

Grazina Gudaite received her doctorate from Vilnius University, Lithuania in 1993. She began her studies in Analytical Psychology at the C.G. Jung Institute of Chicago and continued in Zurich, graduating and becoming an individual member of IAAP in 2001. Presently, she teaches at Vilnius University and works in private practice. Since 1995 she has taught professionals from Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia. Her publications include several books and over 20 articles in psychotherapy and Analytical Psychology.

Vanessa Prins-Goodman was born in France. She trained as a clinical psychologist in Brussels, Belgium and later studied Sandplay Therapy (2005). Thereafter she studied Analytical Psychology via the IAAP and graduated in 2010. Since 2001 she lives and works in private practice with children, adolescents and adults in the Netherlands. She is the president of the Dutch Sandplay Association.





Vicky Reiff (psychotherapist/SPV) received her Masters Degree in Art Therapy at Pratt Institute, New York in 1981. She graduated from the C. G. Jung Institute Zurich in 1995 and has been working in private practice in Zurich with children, adolescents and adults. She has also worked at the Bronx Children's Psychiatric Center, Kinderdorf Pestalozzi, Trogen, and, since 1995, in the Group Project for War-traumatized Children sponsored by the School Psychological Services of the city of Zurich.

Christian Roesler is a Professor of Clinical Psychology at the Catholic University of Applied Sciences in Freiburg/D and a Jungian psychoanalyst in private practice in Freiburg. He is on the faculty of the C.G. Jung-Institutes in Stuttgart and Zurich. He specializes in work with couples and families and in interpretive research methods. Research and publications in the fields of Analytical Psychology and contemporary sciences, couple counselling, postmodern identity construction, narrative research and media psychology.

Svetlana Zdravkovic is a Jungian analyst (member of IAAP and IGAP), specializing in medical psychology. Works as a Jungian Analyst and clinical psychologist at the Institute of Mental Health in Belgrade where she leads a course in "Analytical Psychology and Creativity" with three colleagues from London and Belgrade. She leads workshops on the same subject The Children's Cultural Center in Belgrade. She also lectures England and Switzerland. At the present moment she is completing her PhD thesis in the the field of Analytical Psychology.
