INTRODUCTION

1

The Association of Graduate Analytical Psychologists (AGAP) is a Swiss domiciled association run according to Swiss Association Law. AGAP is a member of the IAAP (International Association of Analytical Psychology) and holds the right to conduct training.

ISAPZURICH is AGAP's delegated training program, and is an extraordinary member of the Swiss Charta for Psychotherapy. Established in the fall of 2004, ISAP offers several avenues of training in the Analytical Psychology of CG Jung, including among others a full-time, post-graduate diploma program.

The languages of instruction are German and English.

These Regulations describe the prerequisites for admission to the Continuing Education Program in the *Fundamental Theory of Analytical Psychology*, and all requirements that lead to the completion of studies.

Students in this program are registered as matriculated auditors. Toward the fulfillment of study requirements, matriculated auditors are entitled to attend all lectures and most seminars (excluding those reserved for diploma candidates).

Completion of studies under these Regulations leads to the award of the *Certificate Fundamental Theory of Analytical Psychology*. This attests to one's knowledge of basic theory and its application to symbolic material, including as well the ability to apply such knowledge in the framework of a written paper. A minimum of two semesters of study is required. Personal analysis during this time is not mandatory, but is strongly recommended, and available in a number of different languages.

For questions not covered by these Regulations, please consult the Director of Studies.

This study program is generally designed for all those interested in deepening their basic knowledge of Jungian psychology. In particular, the program is intended for professionals who are closely involved with people – for instance those in business and management, social work, theology, teaching, natural science, architecture, the arts.

Participation

The fundamentals of Analytical Psychology, and its basic applications, are conveyed in theoretical and practical courses. The particular focus is on the ways of soul, and how these manifest and can be understood in dreams, myth, fairy tale and other symbolical material. While theory is presented in lectures, seminars provide the context for practical application. The more subjective and intimate experience can be gained in the recommended personal analysis.

Curriculum

Basic requirements for the completion of the program:

- at least two semesters of study
- successful completion of a written paper
- passing of an oral exam

Matriculated auditors may apply for transfer into the Diploma Program, with their applications being handled by the Admissions Committee. They may request part of the work completed for the continuing education program to be credited toward the fulfillment of diploma requirements.

ADMISSIONS PREREQUISITES

People of all professions and ages may apply for admission.

The formal prerequisite is a Swiss Matura or equivalent, or completed professional training. A university degree is of course also recognized.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES

Application

3.1

Applicants must submit the following documents:

- Application form (available in the secretariat)
- A recent photo, in double
- Copy of a Swiss Matura, certification of completed professional training, or a university diploma
- A 1–2 page essay describing the motivation to study
- References from 2 people well-acquainted with the applicant (we can not accept references from one's family members and/or from current and previous personal analysts/ psychotherapists)
- Proof of payment of the registration fee; refund is not possible

We treat all personal information with strict confidentiality.

Admission to Studies

3.2

The Director of Studies checks for the submission of all required documents and reviews the personal references.

The Director of Studies informs the applicant about the admissions decision.

Upon notification of admission to the program, the student confirms his/her intention to commence studies in a given semester by submitting the registration form.

The Director of Studies clarifies questions in this regard. Appointments can be made by contacting the secretariat.

The *Certificate* is awarded when the following requirements are fulfilled (see the Overview on p. 7):

4.1

Course Attendance

At least two semesters of study at ISAPZURICH

Students are expected to attend classes regularly, being able at the end to demonstrate attendance of at least 60 double-hour courses.

It is the student's responsibility to have all attendance verified with the instructors' signatures in the individual *Record of Attendance* (Testatheft). This record must be approved by the Director of Studies as a condition for registering for the oral exam.

4.2

Seminar Paper

A seminar paper dealing with symbolic material from the standpoint of Analytical Psychology (on dreams, fairy tales, cultural or religious phenomena, etc.)

The paper must be 10–20 pages, and must be accepted by a Training Analyst or Supervisor of ISAP (see limits under 6.2).

4.3

Exam

A successfully completed exam on the Fundamentals of Analytical Psychology; the list of relevant literature is available in the secretariat.

The exam may be taken at earliest upon the completion of at least two regular semesters of study.

The exam takes place with an examiner and expert of ISAP. The student is free to choose his/her examiner from the relevant list, which is also available in the secretariat (see limits under 6.2).

To register for the exam, the student must submit the registration form (available in the secretariat), and pay the administration fee for the exam and the Certificate.

CERTIFICATE

5

Upon fulfillment of all requirements the student is awarded the *Certificate Fundamental Theory of Analytical Psychology*.

The award of this *Certificate* neither qualifies the bearer to claim the title of Analytical Psychologist, Jungian Psychologist, Jungian Analyst or the like – nor to conduct Jungian analysis, psychotherapy or any other professional practice of Analytical Psychology.

ISAPZURICH does not guarantee the recognition of this *Certificate* by other institutions or authorities. It is up to the individual to determine the validity for his/her professional or educational purposes.

IMPORTANT GENERAL INFORMATION

6

Duty of Confidentiality

6.1

Upon commencement of studies, and no later than the time of the first semester registration, the student returns his/her pledge to uphold the duty of confidentiality, signed in the original.

Separation of Study Functions

6.2

Neither the seminar paper nor the exam may be done with one's previous or present personal analyst or psychotherapist.

Semester Registration

6.3

Students are required to register for studies each semester. The form for this purpose, with the deadline, is always enclosed with the Semester Program.

6.4

During the course of studies it is possible to take a maximum of two semesters' leave of absence. This is permitted only when the appropriate form is submitted ahead of the relevant semester registration deadline, and the leave of absence fee paid.

The semester of leave may not be counted as a semester of study. Seminars may not be attended during a leave of absence. Lectures may be attended, with the status of an auditor who pays the regular admission fee. The use of the library and rooms at ISAP is also permitted during a leave.

6.5

To discontinue studies, the student must inform the Director of Studies in writing no later than the date of the relevant semester registration deadline.
