

Jungian Odyssey 2010 Presenters' Biographies (*)Faculty, ISAPZURICH

Peter Ammann, Dr.phil. studied cello and musicology. He later trained at the CG Jung Institute Zurich and is now a training analyst at ISAPZURICH. He has a private practice in Zurich and Geneva and lectures regularly in Switzerland, South Africa and the UK. After working with Frederico Fellini in Rome, he became an independent documentary filmmaker. His film titles include *Hlonipa: Journey into Wilderness*, *Sandplay with Dora Kalff* and *Spirits of the Rocks*.*

Raffaella Ada Colombo, MD specialized in psychiatry (1992) and graduated from the CG Jung Institute Zurich (2003). Since 1988, she has been working in a psychiatric hospital near Milan, Italy as well as in private practice. She has published articles on epidemiology, psychopathology and psychopharmacology. Her research at the hospital focuses on cognitive impairments of the prefrontal cortex and the limbic system, and aims to link neuroscience and Jung's Analytical Psychology. She regularly lectures on these subjects at ISAPZURICH.*

Diane Cousineau-Brutsche, PhD was born in Montreal, Canada. She received her doctorate in French literature from the University of Paris. She is a graduate of the CG Jung Institute Zurich and has been in private practice in Zurich since 1992. She is a participant and lecturer at ISAPZURICH and has authored various articles as well as a book in French entitled *Le Paradoxe de l'Âme [The Paradox of the Soul]*.*

John Desteian, JD, DPsy graduated from the CG Jung Institute Zurich in 1983. He is a licensed psychologist in private practice in St. Paul, MN. His publications include a book and articles on relationships, and articles on creativity, politics and semantics. Presently, he is working on two books: one concerning phenomenology, hermeneutics and ontology, and the other examining the role of collective consciousness in the political life of the United States.

Brigitte Egger, Dr.sc.nat.ETH is a Jungian training analyst (graduated in 1997) and scientist. She has a private practice in Zurich and works in four languages. As an ecologist she concentrates her research on the psychic and symbolic dimension of collective phenomena such as ecological issues of energy, water, predators, market global-

ization and dance, and works on introducing these dimensions in a concrete way in the area of environmental protection. She lectures and publishes regularly. Her publications include *Reading Collective Events: Ecological Issue of Energy and Globalization of the Market*, *La sacralità dell'acqua [The Sacredness of Water]*, *Raubtiere, mythologisch und tiefenpsychologisch betrachtet [The Predator: Seen from a Mythological and Psychological Perspective]*.*

Deborah Egger, MSW is a training analyst for ISAPZURICH. She maintains a private practice in Stäfa, near Zurich. She is president of AGAP and was a member of the IAAP Executive Committee. Her professional areas of interest are adult development, transference fields and spiritual growth. She is currently writing on the role of the couple in adult development.*

Allan Guggenbühl, Prof.Dr.phil. received his degrees from the University of Zurich in education and psychology and afterwards his diploma from the CG Jung Institute Zurich in 1994. He is director of the Institute for Conflict Management in Bern and is well known for his method of Mythodrama and Crisis Intervention in various Swiss schools. He has many publications, including his celebrated *Men, Power and Myths*.*

John Hill, MA received his degrees in philosophy at the University of Dublin and the Catholic University of America. He trained at the CG Jung Institute Zurich, has practiced as a Jungian analyst since 1973, and is a Training Analyst of ISAPZURICH. His publications include: *The Association Experiment*, *Celtic Myth*, *James Joyce*, *Dreams*, *The Significance of Home* and *Christian Mysticism*. His forthcoming book, *At Home in the World: Sounds and Symmetries of Belonging*, is due to be released in 2010.*

Rita Hurni, MA received her Master of Arts degree in Psychoanalytic Studies from the University of Kent at Canterbury. A graduate of the CG Jung Institute Zurich in 2002, she maintains a private practice in Geneva. She has lectured on a variety of topics including "Femme: féminin-sentiments-eros-anima," "Women and Individuation," "Die Kultur des Anderen als Individuationsweg."

Mario Jacoby, Dr.phil. maintains a private analytical practice in Zurich. He has lectured and held seminars throughout Europe, the USA, South Africa, Latin America and Israel. Among the many articles and six books he has authored: *The Analytic Encounter* (Inner City, 1984); *Individuation and Narcissism* (Routledge, 1989); *Shame and the Origins of Self-Esteem* (Routledge, 1993); and *Jungian Psychotherapy and Contemporary Infant Research* (Routledge, 1999).*

Donald Kalsched, PhD is a Jungian analyst and licensed clinical psychologist who has a private practice in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He is a senior faculty member and supervisor with the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts and for many years served as senior training analyst at the Westchester Institute for Training in Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy in Bedford Hills, NY. His major book *The Inner World of Trauma: Archetypal Defenses of the Personal Spirit* (Routledge, 1996) explores the interface between contemporary psychoanalytic theory and Jungian theory as it relates to clinical work with the survivors of early childhood trauma. The author of many articles on the subject of trauma, he has lectured nationally and internationally. Currently, he is at work on a new book *Trauma and the Soul*. He and his wife Robin, also a Jungian analyst, live in Albuquerque, New Mexico during the winter, and summer in Trinity Bay, Newfoundland, Canada.

Urs Mehlin, Prof.Dr.phil. received his doctorate in psychology, German and French literature from Basel University. In 1967 he became stage manager and assistant director at the Grand Theatre of Geneva. From 1972 to 2002, he was professor at the Teachers Training College of Zurich, where he taught psychology and was an instructor for musical theater. He received his diploma at the CG Jung Institute Zurich and there became a training analyst for candidates working with children, adolescents and adults. He is now a training analyst of ISAPZURICH. His publications include *Psychology, Psychoanalysis and Theater*; and *Analytical Aspects of Artistic Creativity*.*

Isabelle Meier, Dr.phil. is a graduate of the CG Jung Institute Zurich and maintains a private practice in Zurich. She is further trained as a *Guided Affective Imagery* (GAI) therapist. As a faculty member of ISAPZURICH, she serves as a training analyst and Co-Chair of the Jungian Odyssey Committee. She co-edited *Seele und Forschung [Soul and Research]* (Bern: Karger Verlag, 2006), and is the Swiss editor for the German edition of the *Journal of Analytical Psychology*. Her special area of interest lies in the links of imagination, complexes and archetypes.*

Inge Missmahl, lic.phil. holds degrees from Munich and Tübingen in social sciences and literature. She trained as a dancer in Paris, London and New York and is the director of the International Dance and Theater School of Constance, Germany. Presently she is involved with humanitarian institutes in Afghanistan, Pakistan and Indonesia working with trauma and training people in psychosocial counseling. She maintains a private practice in Constance.*

Dariane Pictet, AdvDipExPsy received her degree in Comparative Religion from Columbia University, New York. She also attended drama school, has published two anthologies of poetry, and completed the Body/Soul Leadership Training with the Marion Woodman Foundation. Her experiential workshops bring together myth, movement and painting. She is a Visiting Lecturer at Regent's College SPC, a member of the Society of Existential Analysis and an analyst of ISAPZURICH. She is an Executive Officer of AGAP and a Trustee of the Guild of Analytical Psychology and Spirituality. She is currently researching women's midlife transition from a Jungian perspective and maintains a private practice in London.*

Christian Roesler, Prof. Dr. Dipl.Psych. is a Professor of Clinical Psychology at the Catholic University of Applied Sciences in Freiburg, Germany, a Jungian psychoanalyst in private practice in Freiburg, and a member of the faculty of the CG Jung Institute in Stuttgart and Zurich. He specializes in work with couples and families, as well as inter-

pretive research methods. Research and publications are on: Analytical Psychology and contemporary sciences, couples counseling, postmodern identity construction, narrative research, and media psychology.

Ingela Romare, MD graduated from the CG Jung Institute, Zurich in 1997. She works as an analyst with a private praxis in Malmö, Sweden. She is also a Film Director, educated at the Swedish Film Institutes' Film School 1965-68. She has made about 50 documentary films on political, social and existential questions. One of her films, *On the Dignity of the Human Soul*, is about how inner imagination can help a person to survive torture and being imprisoned under inhuman conditions. Her film *On Love* is the third part in the film trilogy, *Faith, Hope and Love*, produced for Swedish Television in 2004.*

Bernard Sartorius, lic.theol. received his degree in theology from Geneva University in 1965 and worked for several years as a protestant minister, first in a parish and then in youth work. He graduated from the CG Jung Institute Zurich in 1974, maintaining his private analytical practice first in Geneva, and since 1997 in Lucerne and Zurich. He is a training analyst at ISAPZURICH. His publications include a book on the Orthodox Church, and many papers (in *Vouivre*, Lausanne) on symbolical subjects, such as, *A Pilgrimage to Mecca*.*

Judith Savage, LICSW, LMFT is a Jungian Analyst in private practice in St. Paul, MN. She studied at the CG Jung Institute and is a graduate of the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts. She serves on the IRSJA Training Committee, is the former coordinator of the Minnesota Seminar in Jungian Studies, and the author of *Mourning Unlived Lives: A Psychological Study of Childbearing Loss* as well as several articles and book chapters.

Kristina Schellinski, MA holds a degree in political science and literature. From 1983–1998 she worked for the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF). She graduated from the CG Jung Institute Zurich in 2002, culminating training with her thesis, *Oh,*

Brother—A Woman's Search for the Missing Masculine. A Jungian Perspective on the Challenges and Opportunities Faced by a Replacement Child. She has taught at the CG Jung Institute Zurich as well as at ISAPZURICH, and has lectured at international congresses. She is a founding member of the Rencontres Jungiennes at Lavigny, Switzerland. Ms. Schellinski is the mother of two young boys and enjoys creative writing in her spare time.*

Jody Schlatter, MD was born in Canada and studied Medicine in Vancouver and Zurich, training in Psychiatry in the Zurich area. She has practiced as a psychotherapist since 1992, as a Jungian analyst since 1996 and is a training analyst of ISAPZURICH, as well as member of the Board of Advisors to the Jung Center in Bangalore, India. Her interests include Mysticism and the I Ching. Her publications include articles on Julian of Norwich, Individuation and Life after Death. She lives outside of Zurich with her husband and children, ages 12 and 10.*

Murray Stein, PhD is a training analyst and president of ISAPZURICH. From 2001–2004 he served as president of the International Association for Analytical Psychology (IAAP). He is a founding member of two IAAP societies: Inter-Regional Society for Jungian Analysts (USA) and the Chicago Society of Jungian Analysts. Among the many books he has authored are *Jung's Treatment of Christianity; In Midlife; Transformation—Emergence of the Self; and Jung's Map of the Soul*. He is the editor of *Jungian Analysis* (Open Court) and co-editor of the *Chiron Clinical Series* (Chiron Publications).*

Robin van Loben Sels, PhD was born in California. She received her doctorate in Psychiatry and Religion from Union Theological Seminary in New York City, was a graduate of the CG Jung Institute of New York, and also attended the Jung Institute in Zurich when it was still on Gemeindestrasse. She recently moved from the East Coast with her husband, Donald Kalsched, to live in Albuquerque, New Mexico where she continues a limited practice, supervi-

sion, and teaching. Her professional affiliations include the Inter-Regional Association of Jungian Analysts, and IAAP. She has authored several articles, a book of poetry and a book on which she is currently teaching a seminar in Tesuque, New Mexico, entitled *A Dream in the World* (Routledge, 2003).

Joanne Wieland, PhD Jungian analyst, graduated in 1981 from the CG Jung Institute in Zurich. She moved to Germany in

1988 and works in private practice. She continues to teach in Zürich. A training analyst since 1991, in 1999 she began a supervision group in Munich, and has been devoted to the question of the impact of the Nazi period on clients in Germany. Therapists from various schools (Jungian, Freudian, group analysts) meet 4 to 5 times a year to discuss pertinent cases together. She has lectured on the subject in many countries as well as in schools in Munich.*
