Josef Marty

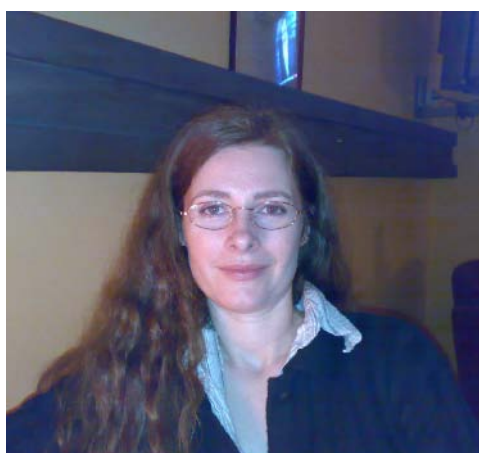
